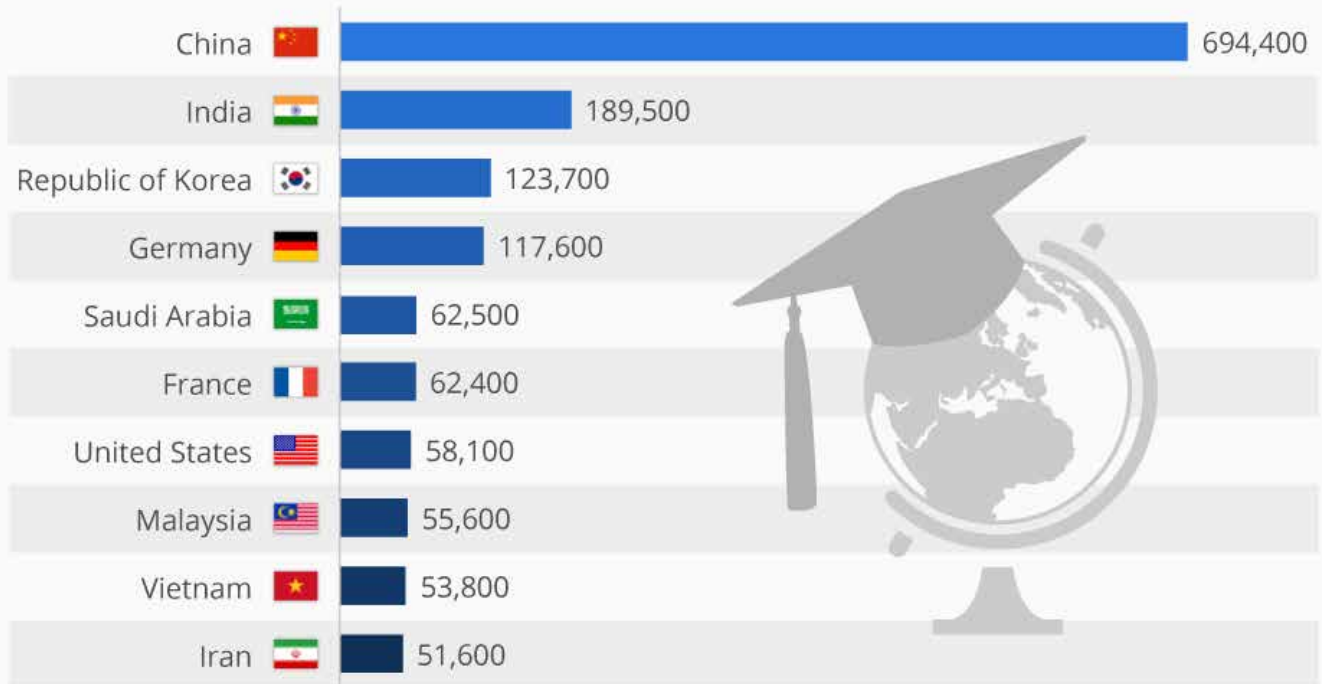

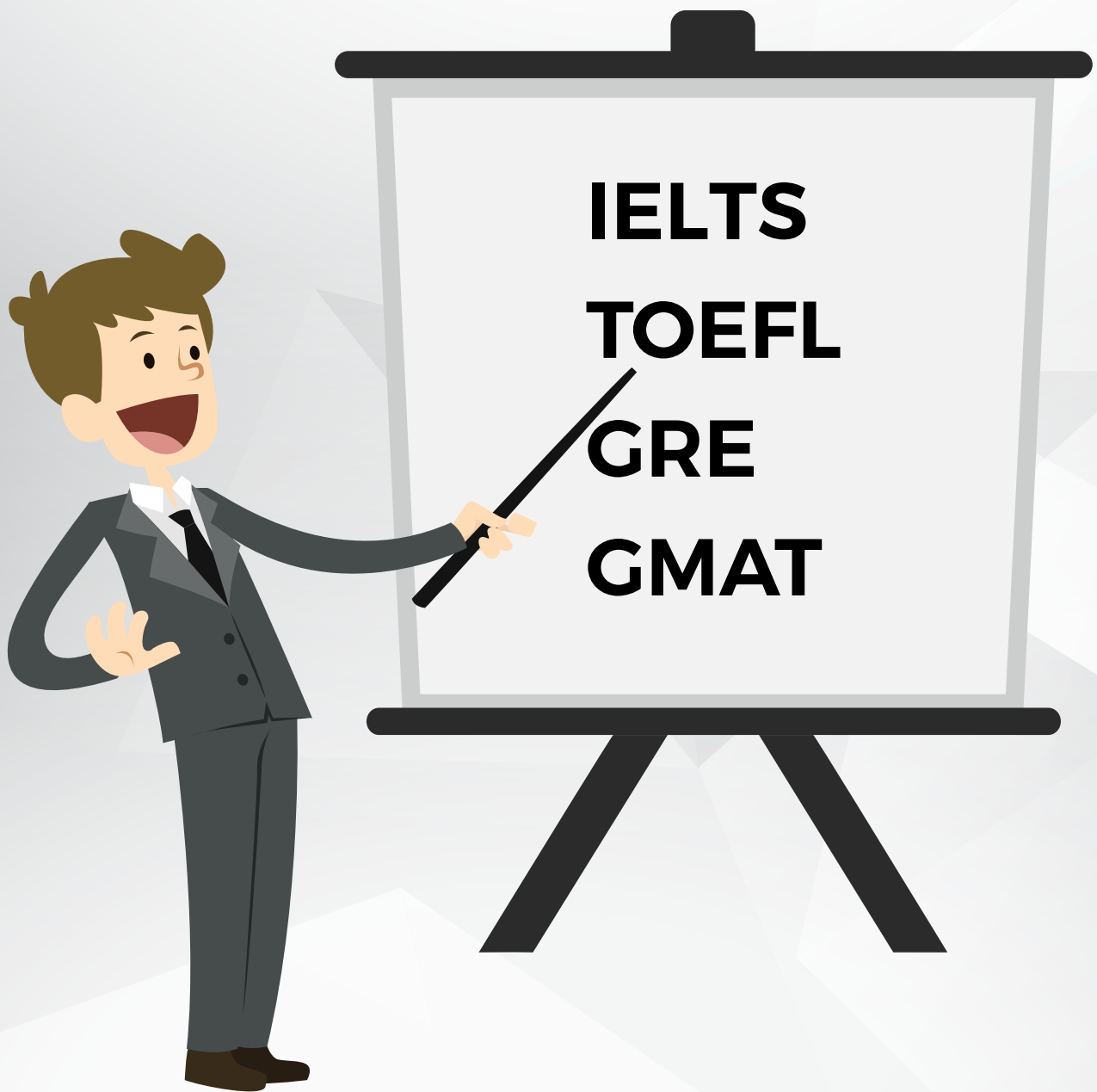

- It can be taken in 44 cities across India and Coimbatore is one centre



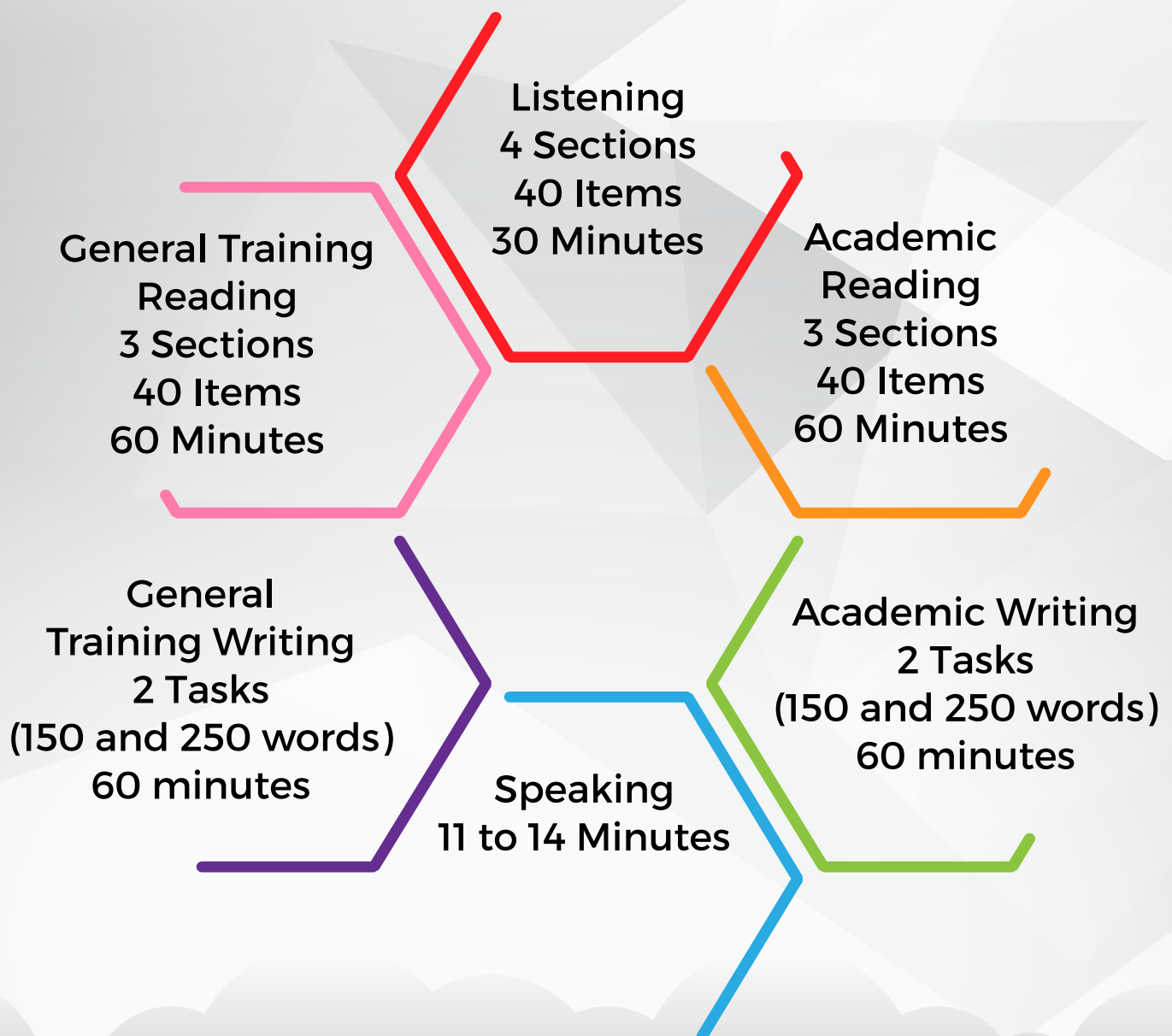

# BAND SCORE & EVALUATION LEVEL

---

The IELTS 9-band scale - Each band corresponds to a level of English competence. All parts of the test and the Overall Band Score can be reported in whole and half bands, eg 6.5, 7.0, 7.5, 8.0.

- Band 9: Expert user
- Band 8: Very good user
- Band 7: Good user
- Band 6: Competent user
- Band 5: Modest user
- Band 4: Limited user
- Band 3: Extremely limited user
- Band 2: Intermittent user
- Band 1: Non-user
- Band 0: Did not attempt the test

# TOEFL IBT STRUCTURE

## TOEFL iBT Test Sections

Section	Time Limit	Questions	Tasks
Reading*	60–80 minutes	36–56 questions	Read 3 or 4 passages from academic texts and answer questions.
Listening	60–90 minutes	34–51 questions	Listen to lectures, classroom discussions and conversations, then answer questions.
Break	10 minutes	—	—
Speaking	20 minutes	6 tasks	Express an opinion on a familiar topic; speak based on reading and listening tasks.
Writing	50 minutes	2 tasks	Write essay responses based on reading and listening tasks; support an opinion in writing.

# GRE STRUCTURE

## Structure of the Computer-based Test

Measure	Number of Questions	Allotted Time
<b>Analytical Writing</b> (One section with two separately timed tasks)	One "Analyze an Issue" task and one "Analyze an Argument" task	30 minutes per task
<b>Verbal Reasoning</b> (Two sections)	Approximately 20 questions per section	30 minutes per section
<b>Quantitative Reasoning</b> (Two sections)	Approximately 20 questions per section	35 minutes per section
<b>Unscored<sup>1</sup></b>	Varies	Varies
<b>Research<sup>2</sup></b>	Varies	Varies

## SCORING

- Verbal Scaled Score (on a scale from 0 to 60)

- Analytical Writing Assessment (AWA) Score (on a scale from 0 to 6)
- Integrated Reasoning section is scored on a scale of 1 to 8, in one-point increments.
